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## NATIONAL HUI INVOLVING THE MAORI COMMUNITY ON NURSING EDUCATION

One of the primary reasons why the National Council of Maori Nurses was formed, was to encourage recruitment of Maori people into the nursing profession. Our Council members are aware that there are many reasons why there is a lack of greater Maori participation in nursing. We are staging this hui specifically to address the needs, thoughts and feelings of Maori people on the nursing profession, because we know that Maori people have never before been invited to do this.

We are not especially asking you to write your submissions down and send them in by a set date as is the usual request when dealing with these matters, all we ask is that if you have some thoughts and feelings about nursing, then please feel free to come to our hui and korero.

We have set out some objectives and key aspects which may be covered so that you may feel there will be some clarity of direction to the whole hui.

### Our objectives are:

1. To invite comment from Maori people on the direction and education of people in the nursing profession.
2. To state ways in which Maori cultural values and health concepts can be fostered and actively practised throughout the nursing system of education.
3. To communicate the thoughts and feelings of Maori people about nursing, to those in the nursing and health related professions who are willing to make changes in their structures which will uncompromisingly include Maori participation.

In order to meet these objectives, the hui will cover the following aspects related to nursing education:

#### (a) RECRUITMENT

Pre-nursing courses. The Maori school pupil. Unemployment.

#### (b) SELECTION PANELS/ADVISORY COMMITTEES

Their composition. Their relevance. The interview dynamics.

#### (c) CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT

The Maori nursing student. The Maori nursing tutor.  
The case for the Maori perspective throughout the nursing education programmes.

(d) EXAMINATION & REGISTRATION

Who is safe to practise?  
Whose standards and criteria are being met?

(e) NEW MODELS
